

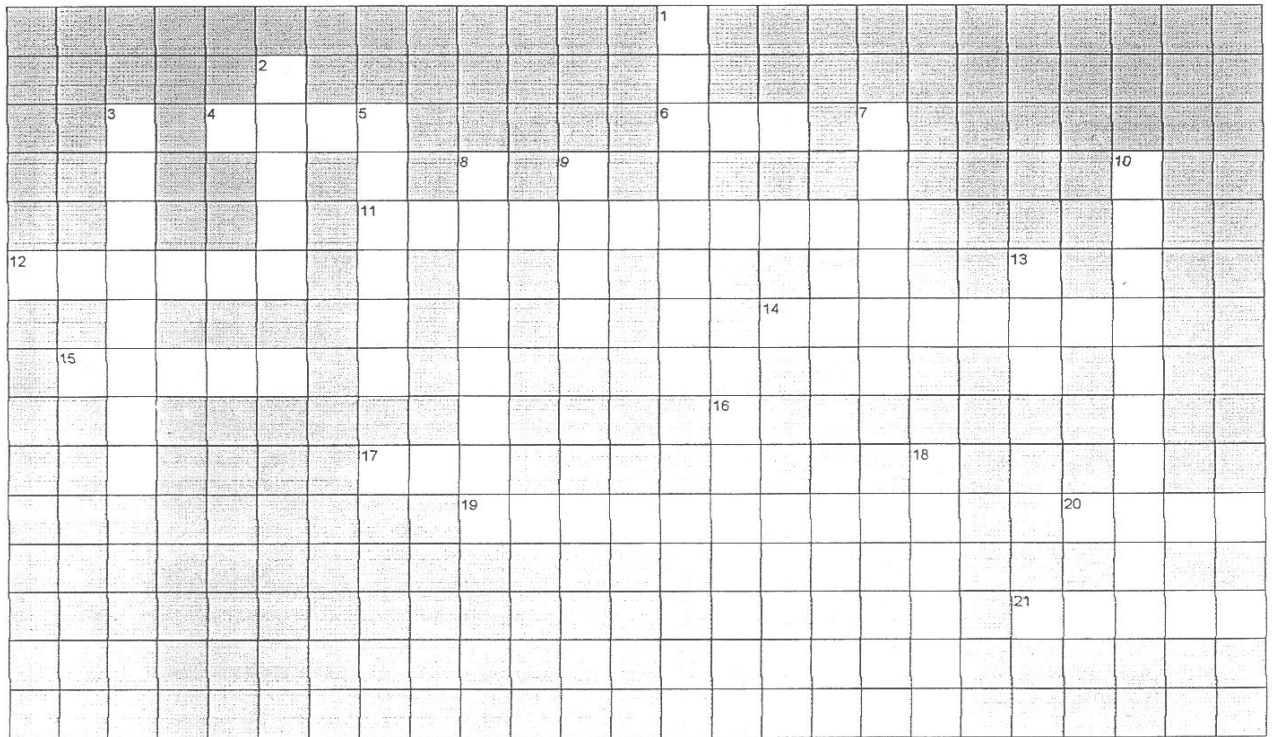

It is very important that these rules be followed on the trail, to insure that everyone has a safe and enjoyable experience. We will also discuss them next week before heading to the trail; that would be a great time to ask questions if there is anything you're unsure of. **HAPPY TRAILS TO YOU!!**

'TRAIL RIDE RULES

1. Keep horses in line. Do not allow your horse to parallel or pass another horse.
2. Maintain about a horse length between horses. You should be able to look between your horse's ears and see the hooves of the horse in front of you most of the time.
3. Do not put on or take off any clothing while riding. This may spook the horse.
4. "Runaway" procedure--WE HAVE NEVER HAD A RUNAWAY HORSE ON A TRAIL RIDE AT CAMP KAVOD. If a horse runs away, all other horses stop. Horses are herd animals and will not usually leave the other horses.
5. Do not take pictures during the trail ride.
6. If a rider falls from a horse, all other riders stop. WE HAVE NEVER HAD A RIDER FALL FROM A HORSE DURING OUR TRAIL RIDES.
7. If you need assistance, ask your instructor. Do not attempt to adjust stirrups or any other tack by yourself.
8. If you drop a rein, ask for assistance from your instructor.
9. Have fun!!! God gave us these creatures to enjoy them.
